



 Exports from Arkansas helped contribute to the \$2.21 trillion of U.S. goods and services exports in 2016.



Arkansas's Top 5 Export Categories (Millions of U.S. Dollars)




Exports Support Jobs

 Nationally, U.S. jobs supported by exports reached an estimated 11.5 million in 2015, up 1.9 million from 2009.

Exports Sustain Thousands of Arkansas Businesses


 A total of 2,365 companies exported from Arkansas locations in 2014. 1,879

...and **21%** of known Arkansas goods export value






Free Trade Agreements

- The U.S. currently has 14 free trade agreements in force with 20 countries.
- Arkansas's exports to U.S. FTA partners totaled \$2.7 billion in 2016.

In 2016, exports to FTA markets accounted for 47% of Arkansas exports



Since 2006, exports from Arkansas to FTA markets have grown by 33%



Arkansas's Metropolitan Exports

 Memphis is the 26th largest metro area reporting exports nationwide.
